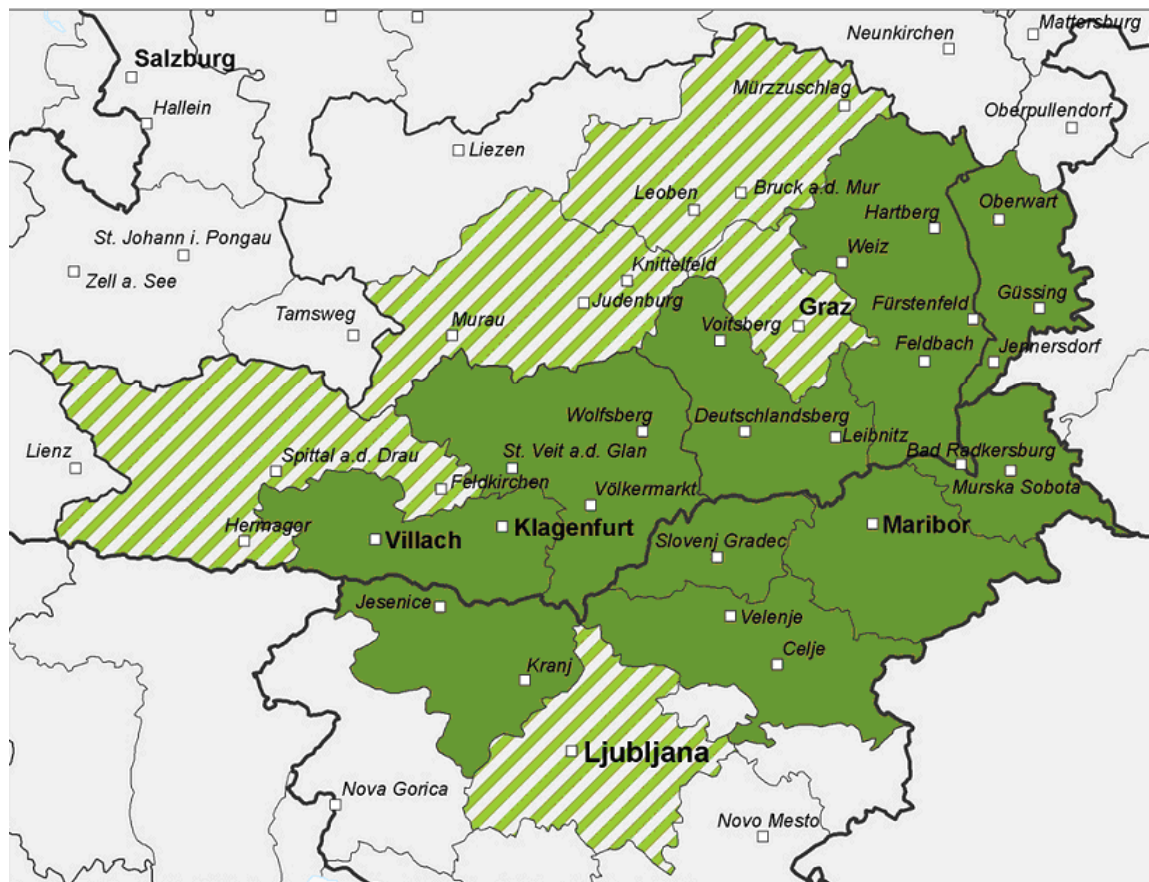

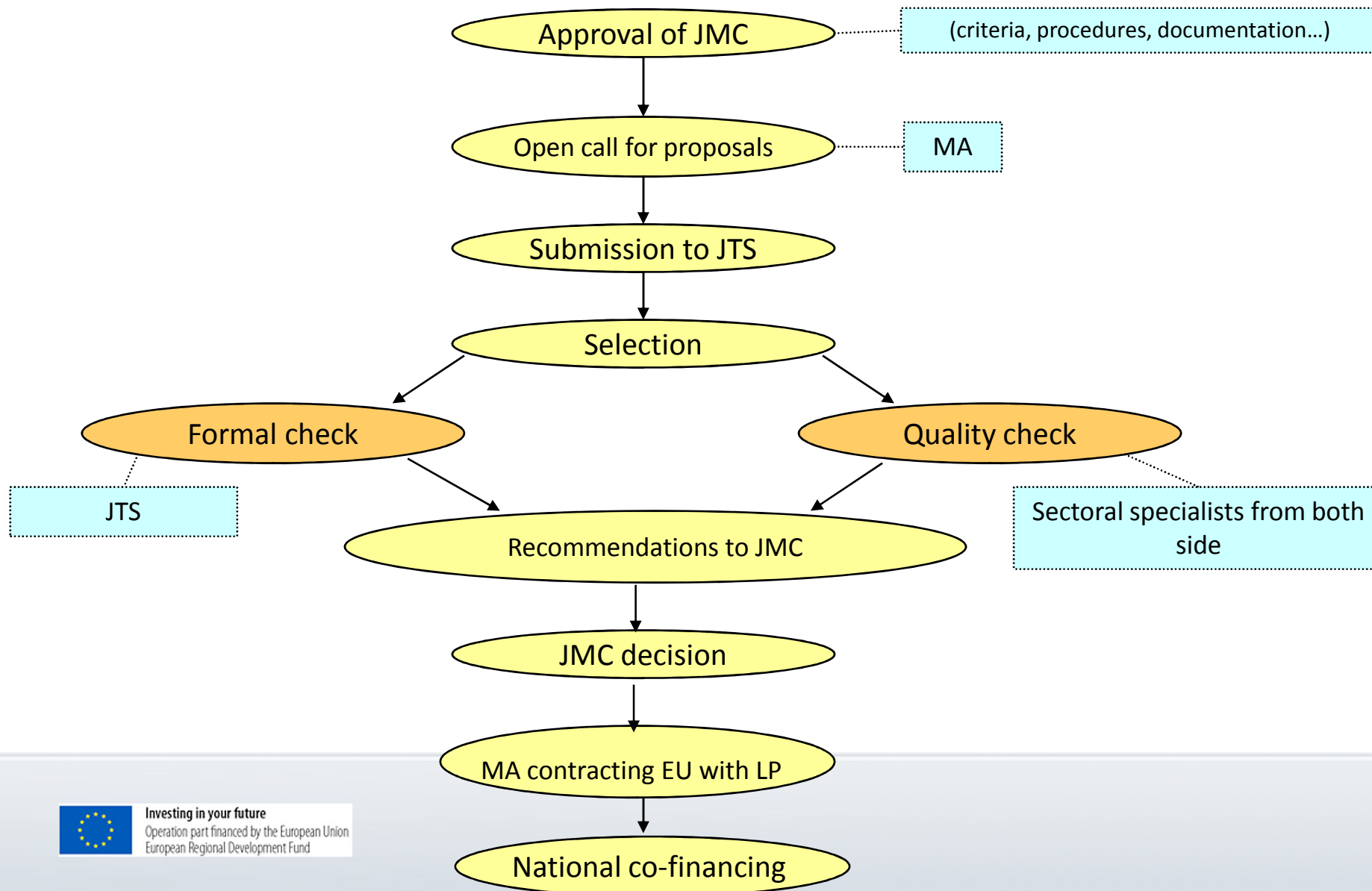

LEAD PARTNER PRINCIPLE

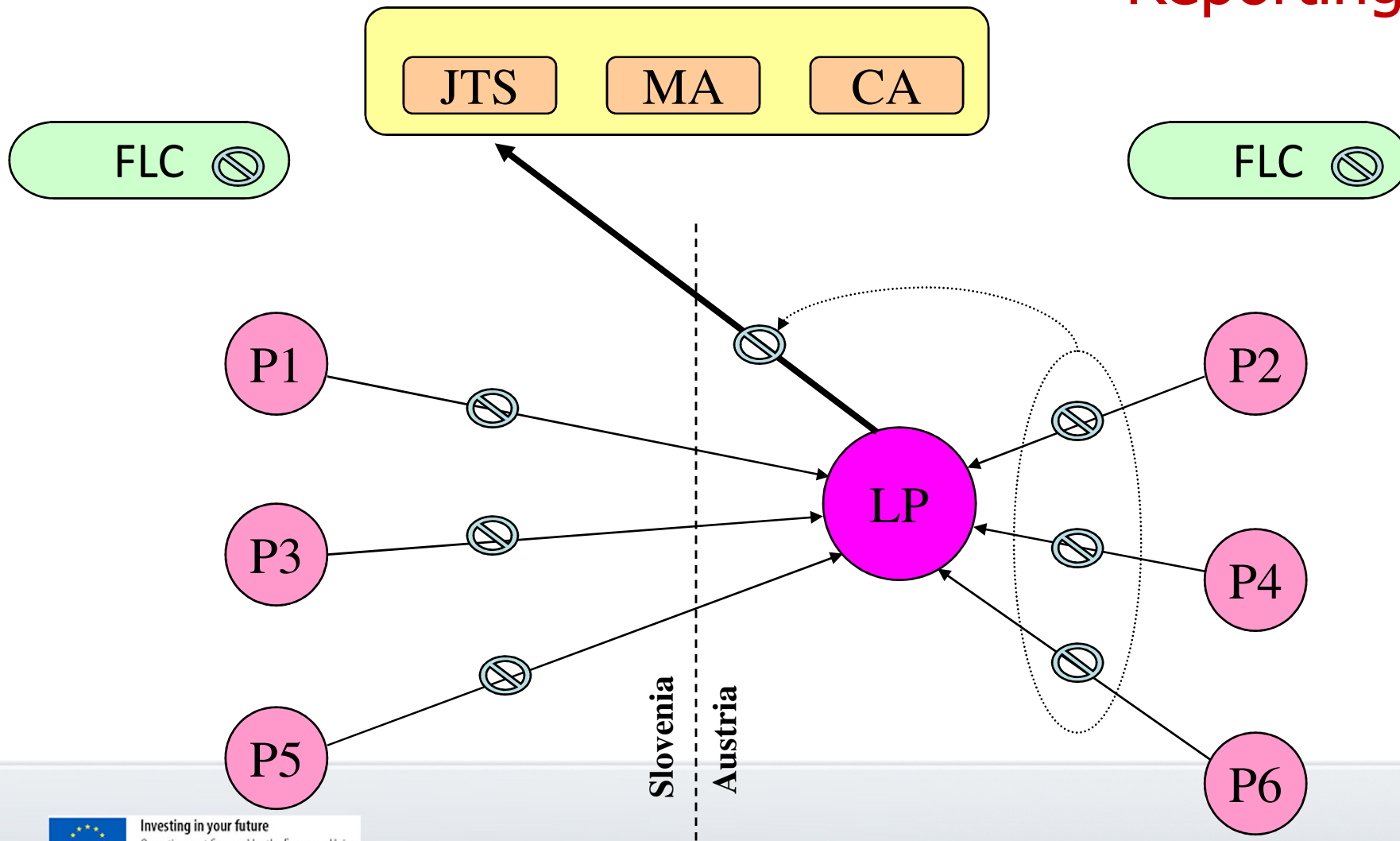
Impacts on project level

- ➔ Lead Partner Principle ensures cross-border cooperation by building it into the partnership structure
- ➔ The responsibilities of the lead partner will increase
- ➔ Financial implications (*Changes in the Subsidy Contract and Partnership Agreement*)
- ➔ The development of a project based on LP takes more time
- ➔ First Level Control per project partner (*The LP collects all declarations of first level control from partners*)
- ➔ Financial responsibility

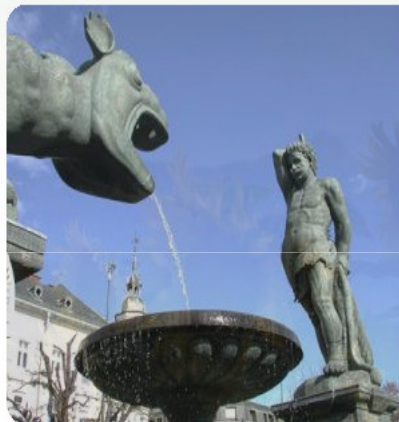

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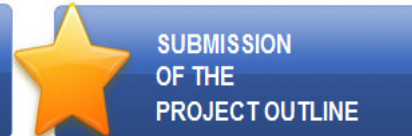
